That the officers recommendation not be adopted and the application be refused on the following grounds:-

1 The proposed is contrary to the intent of Precinct 4 of the Planning Scheme which requires

The Future Business and Industry Precinct to the east of the Pacific Motorway is expected to become General Impact Business and Industry. The area to the west of the Pacific Motorway, west of Stanmore and Sandy Creek Roads will be appropriate for a mix of general and low impact business and industry, depending on its proximity to residential areas.

2 PC7 – Building Height

The industry proposal is in conflict with Performance Criteria PC7 of the Yatala Local Area Plan. A 30 metre high chimney/stack will compromise the local

landscape character, which includes the nearby residential communities of Yatala and Ormeau.

3 PC43 – Amenity

The proposed industry development will detract from the amenity of the local area, having regard but not limited to, the impact of

- i. Noise
- ii. Hours of Operation
- iii. Traffic
- iv. Visual Amenity
- v. Odour and Emissions

4 DEO SOCIAL 5

The proposal will not ensure the maintenance of the residential amenity, through the minimisation of any environmental harm occurring from the construction and operation of the industry activities.

5 PC44 – Amenity

The proposed development does not sufficiently take into account and seek to ameliorate any negative aspects of the existing amenity of the local area, having regard, but not limited to, the existing impact of

- i. Noise
- ii. Hours of Operation



Integrated Planning Act

APPEAL RIGHTS FOR APPROVAL OR REFUSAL OF DEVELOPMENT APPLICATIONS FOR MATERIAL CHANGE OF USE, RECONFIGURATION OF A LOT OR OPERATIONAL WORKS APPLICATIONS.

4.1.27 Appeals by applicants

- An applicant for a development application may appeal to the court against any of the following -
 - (a) the refusal, or the refusal in part, of a development application;
 - (b) a matter stated in a development approval, including any condition applying to the development, and the identification of a code under section 3.1.6; **
 - (c) the decision to give a preliminary approval when a development permit was applied for;
 - (d) the length of a relevant period;
 - (e) a deemed refusal.
- (2) An appeal under subsection (1)(a) to (d) must be started within 20 business days (the "applicant's appeal period") after the day the decision notice or negotiated decision notice is given to the applicant.
- (3) An appeal under subsection (1)(e) may be started at any time after the last day a decision on the matter should have been made.
